Understanding by Design: Welcome to the Beat Generation

Stage 1-Desired Results

Students will read and write in a variety of genres and styles.

Students will be able to communicate effectively, concisely, coherently, and imaginatively; recognize the power of language and use that power ethically and creatively; and be at ease communicating in an increasingly technological world.

Understandings:

Students will understand:

- -The evolution of a counter-culture literary movement into an established & anthologized literary *canon*.
- -The role of spontaneity & formality in the key literary works.
- -The evolution of the term *beat* as used to describe the Beat Generation.

Students will know:

- -Four major writers of the time and related works
- -Define evolving definition of *beat*
- -List characteristics of *rebel writing* and *crazy wisdom*

Essential Questions:

- -What role does *rebel writing* play in society?
- -How can crazy wisdom inform creativity?
- -What do the major writings of the Beat Generation say about the human condition?

Students will be able to:

- -Identify examples of *rebel writing* outside of the Beat Generation canon
- -Compose, edit & publish writing on a weblog
- -Evaluate criticism; write a thesis statement and present findings to group

- -Critical thinking exercise with four writing examples
- -Culminating presentation of final product; could include poem, essay, music, video or other artwork {student choice}
